Obviously is the second of four exhibitions curated by sweet pea and taking place at our Lawson Flats space during 2023. Each exhibition will explore ways to imbue the so called 'ordinary' with meaning and power.

*Obviously* brings together four artists whose practices are driven by process meaning that the images and objects they create are not fully premeditated but manifest through their engagement with techniques, medium, feeling and spirit. In this way the process of art making can reveal untapped questions, stories, and knowledge that - when looking at the finished work - can be so revealing or true as to seem obvious in hindsight.

### Marla Bendini

Darkest Before Dawn 2022 Oil on Linen \$7,500

Soften Our Hearts and Harden Our Feet 2022 Oil and oil pastel on linen \$6,000 Marla Bendini is an artist who works in painting, text, sound and performance to articulate the multi-faceted transgender experience on her own terms. Her current practice uses the female gaze through a combination of writing, drawing, painting, collage and printmaking to create layered 'documentations' of a unique woman's experience. Her painting Soften Our Hearts and Harden Our Feet takes a queer reading of the figure of saint Michael and depicts the saint here as muscular, heroic, and anonymous. In Darkest Before Dawn Marla herself is now depicted with face obscured, embracing a close friend while both are naked and vulnerable to the weather.

# Nazerul Ben-Dzulkefli

Must I stay put 2023 Glazed stoneware

Nazerul Ben-Dzulkefli works predominantly – although not exclusively – in ceramics and whose work is informed by the cultures of Singapore and the Malay Archipelago. His work often taps into themes of death and afterlife, religion, family and the potentials and limits of language. For Obviously, Nazerul's work Must I stay put consists of stone forms inscribed with glyphs of a personal script derived from Arabic and old Malay. Parts of the script refer to folk stories in which a character is turned to stone after spurning his mother, others to Islamic teachings around respect for parents. Must I stay put is a rumination on the complex feelings surrounding migration and obligation to family left behind, processed through a direct and tactile engagement with clay.

Patrick Carter tells his stories through performance, video, movement, painting, music and sound and his work often explores stories of family, camping on country, love and connection. He often collapses disciplines in his video works where dance moves, music and spoken word unfold as an expansive drawing process. For Obviously Patrick presents the video work Process which follows the making of a drawing created using silhouettes and tracings of hand moulded clay forms. In this work the medium of drawing becomes a playful and animated world building technique.

### Luisa Hansal

You listen and he dies 2022 Oil on cotton canvas board \$3,500 Inspired by spiritualist and mystic painters,  $Luisa\ Hansal$  approaches art making as an entryway into inner space. Through painting a visual language of forms and symbols appear, bringing forth a tender understanding of some deeper meaning she often can't articulate through speech. There is a tension between the tangible and psychic nature of painting she finds almost magical. Through the act of painting Luisa attempts to refine her visual expression of personal grief, compassion, and sentiment.
